<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • modify a <i>verb</i>: e.g.: She <i>sings</i> <u>beautifully</u>. 	<p><u>We use adjectives after:</u></p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • modify any <i>adjective</i>: e.g.: It is <u>terribly</u> <i>cold</i> today. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • BE/GET/BECOME/SEEM: e.g.: Be careful. Don't get mad at me. e.g.: She is beautiful.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • modify an <i>adverb</i>: e.g.: She sings <u>absolutely</u> <i>beautifully</i>. He plays <u>definitely</u> well. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • TASTE/ SMELL/ HEAR /SEE/ FEEL/ SOUND/ e.g.: You look tired. I feel good. It sounds awful.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • modify an <i>adverbial phrase</i>: e.g.: He was <u>madly</u> <i>in love</i> with her. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • modify a <i>noun or thing</i>: e.g.: A <u>beautiful</u> <i>song</i>.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • modify a <i>past participle</i>: e.g.: This steak is very <u>badly</u> <i>cooked</i>. 	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • modify a <i>whole sentence</i>: e.g.: <u>Unfortunately</u>, <i>I cannot come</i>.
